


FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY

Getting Married in 2021

If you're planning to be married here are some important things to remember. While you need only give four months notice of your intention to marry it is common practice for a couple to book the church a long time in advance.

So please contact the Parish Office (057 8624390) to check if the church is available on the day you require. No dates will be reserved until our 'booking/ registration' form is completed. You will also need to participate in a marriage preparation course for details see (www.accord.ie).

The Government also has important requirements which must be fulfilled; most importantly you have to give the Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages at least 3 months notice of your intentions to marry.
