At the opening of the Church St. Patrick's Day in 1970 eight young people celebrated their Confirmation. It is hoped all

eight will join us again this Sunday - 52½ years later. There were four weddings in the Church that year and it is hoped to have those people along as well. Local priest, Fr. Tony McEvoy, SDB, was ordained in the Church in 1972 so he celebrates the Golden Jubilee of his ordination this year. He too will join us. Over the years many local people have designed and gifted religious art pieces to the church: the stained-glass representation of the risen Christ and the door over the tabernacle; the Baptismal Font and Pascal Candle Holder; the Good Friday Cross; a new Christmas Crib; Bog Oak crosses supporting the Holy Water Fonts and altar cloths in the very distinctive Mountmellick Work. Bishop Nulty celebrates the (belated) Golden Jubilee mass this Sunday at 3.00pm as this community remembers 50 years and looks to the future with a togetherness and a vision to foster and nourish faith, hope, and love in the name of Jesus, saviour, teacher and friend.
