



The readings this week focus on the generosity of the Lord who feeds his people 'till they want no more', both physically and spiritually. In the 1<sup>st</sup> reading, Elisha, the man of God, feeds a hundred people with only twenty barley loaves. Despite the misgivings of Elisha's servant, everyone is fed and there are some left over. This

story is of course the precursor of the feeding of the five thousand, which is today's Gospel. Despite Philip and Andrew's doubts, five loaves and two fish feed everyone, and yet twelve baskets are still left over. This week then, we might pray that all those who hunger for food and for God may be satisfied. We also ask the Lord to help us give generously when we come across people in need, and to find ways of working towards greater unity and peace.

## <u>St Ignatius of Loy</u>ola July 31<sup>st</sup>

Ignatius lived in Spain during the sixteenth century. It was a time of kingdoms and battles, armies and soldiers. While recovering from a serious battle injury he read two particular books, one about the life of Christ, and the other a collection of saints' stories. That reading helped him decide that he would use the talents God had given him — his strength, his leadership ability, his bravery, and his intelligence — to serve God and God's people. He gathered nine friends who felt the same way he did, and together they made a promise to God. They were the founders of the Company of Jesus, also called the Jesuits.

Jesuit Prayer: Take, Lord, and receive all my liberty, my memory, my understanding, and my entire will, All I have and call my own. You have given all to me. To you, Lord, I return it. Everything is yours; do with it what you will. Give me only your love and your grace, that is enough for me. Amen.


