I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE

Today's 1st reading tells how the people of Israel were grumbling about the painful new life they were living in the desert. God heard their cry and gave them all that they needed to survive. In the Gospel, Jesus challenges us: he doesn't want followers who are just looking for material security and a guarantee of plenty of food to eat. Following

Jesus requires a more radical response. Our true spiritual food isn't manna from heaven; rather it is to be found in a personal encounter with the risen Christ, the Bread of Life and truth eternal. We are invited to be transformed by the Bread of Life, made flesh in Jesus, and present in the word of God. As we consider the meaning of this week's scripture readings, we pray for a spirit of complete transformation and renewal in ourselves, and in our faith communities. May we have the grace to remain sustained by the life-giving word of God.

Congratulations Bishop Nulty.

It was on Sunday August 4th, 2013, that Bishop Nulty took up his appointment in our diocese. A native of Slane, Co. Meath, Denis Nulty was ordained a priest for Meath diocese on June 12th, 1988. On his appointment as our bishop, he took the motto "Serve the Lord with Gladness" a pledge he has kept very faithfully. We wish him many more years of good health and fruitful ministry in Kildare and Leighlin.

The Transfiguration of the Lord – Aug 6th.

Before his death on Calvary Jesus took three of his disciples, Peter, James, and John up a high mountain—probably Mount Tabor. There, while the apostles watched, Jesus' face began to shine much more brightly than the sun. His garments became as white as snow. Peter exclaimed, "Lord, it is good for us to be here". Then the apostles heard a voice saying, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" In this 'moment' Jesus gave these apostles a glimpse of his divine identity in order to strengthen their faith in preparation for the ordeals of his coming passion and death.

St. John Vianney, Aug 4th. The Curé of Ars.

A few years after he was ordained (1815) John Vianney was assigned to Ars, a village of about 50 families in France. Within a few years, Father Vianney was spending 10 - 15 hours a day in the confessional. He slowly helped to revive the community's faith through both his prayers and the witness of his lifestyle. He gave powerful homilies on the mercy and love of God, and it is said that even staunch sinners were converted upon hearing him. People from all over France and other countries came to consult him. Renowned for his hard, yet simple, way of prayer, fasting, and penance The 'Curé of Ars' died on Aug 4th, 1859, at the age of 73. He was canonized in 1925 and is the patron saint of parish priests.
